Statement of Export Control Principles

Rojone Pty Ltd attaches a high priority to understanding, and complying with, Australian export controls. We will give priority to complying with all Australian export laws over our commercial interests.

Our employees will actively assist in complying with export controls. We will put in place policies and procedures that support our commitment to comply with these controls. We will train our employees in these policies and procedures. Relevant employees will learn, and strictly abide by, applicable national and international export control legislation and requirements.

Rojone will not, unless permitted to do so by an approval issued by the relevant Australian Government agency, neither directly nor indirectly supply commodities, technology or services if we have reason to believe that such items will be used for the development or production of Weapons of Mass Destruction or their delivery systems.

We will exercise the same restraint domestically. If we have reason to believe that a product or service could be diverted to a Weapons of Mass Destruction or delivery system project in a sensitive country, we will not proceed with the transaction unless permitted to do so by an approval issued by the relevant Australian Government agency.

Rojone Pty. Ltd. will maintain regular contact with government agencies connected with export policy, e.g. the Defence Export Control Office, and the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade. In the event of any doubt about a transaction, Rojone will contact the responsible agency for information and advice. If concerns continue about the end-use of an item or a service, Rojone will not continue with the transaction.
