Request for "Conflict Minerals" information

Thank you for your inquiry requesting information regarding the "Conflict Mineral" status of Rojone products. We are aware of the rule issued by the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) and the reporting requirements it imposed upon US publicly traded companies. As an Australian company, Rojone is not required to report to the SEC, although a number of our customers are required to do so, and we have taken appropriate measures to support these customers. We will continue to work with our suppliers to ensure we meet this US regulated requirement.

Rojone has completed and made a Company declaration on the latest version of the Conflict Minerals reporting template (CMRT V3.02 07 Nov 14). A copy is available on request; it confirms that we have a Conflict Minerals policy, and that that we working with our suppliers to provide DRC conflict-free products, and that we are actively requesting and collecting CMRTs from affected suppliers. It also identifies the smelters used by our suppliers in sourcing Conflict Minerals.
